Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Reporting (HEERF) - Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA), and the American Rescue Plan (ARP)

- D. A. Dorsey Technical College acknowledgements that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) under the CARES Act, Section 314 (a)(1) under the CRRSAA, and Section 2003(a)(1) under ARP to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
- The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students: \$178,529.00 (Funds are not accessible yet)

- The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under HEERF:
 - O Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act (HEERF I):
 - **Formula:** The first CARES Act allocation was divided by the total number of eligible students/recipients to determine the amount of disbursement for each eligible student.
 - Process: Technical college staff identified recipients from the potential eligible student list provided by the District. Eligible students must complete and submit the Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under Section 18004 of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act Student Affidavit. After submission, the recipient will receive his/her check for the predetermined amount. To that end, said affidavit is posted on the technical college's website with a contact number to reach designated personnel to facilitate process. Funds will be distributed equally to eligible students within the technical college.



- Section 314(a)(1) of the CRRSAA (HEERF II) and Section 2003(a)(1) of the ARP (HEERF III):
 - Formula / Process: students will complete a grant application to determine eligibility and tier classification based on need. Once all applications are collected, an amount for tier 1 will be determined. Tier 2 students will receive 50% of the tier 1 amount.
- Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants:

The institution has sent a Notice of Eligibility via phone calls and email to those students identified as eligible to receive funding with instructions on how to obtain the Emergency financial Aid Grant. All 55 students who was eligible did receive their Emergency Financial Aid Grant.

Student must have been enrolled in a CTE program or an apprenticeship program during January – March 2020

- Complete and sign a student affidavit; including the following criteria has been met:
 - o U.S. citizenship or eligible
 - o A valid Social Security number
 - o Registration with Selective Service (if the student is Male)
 - o A high school diploma, GED, or completion of high school in an approved homeschool setting

Additional grant funds that the school received has been processed and distributed following a similar procedure.
